They're simple ideas, but Ruth uses them to help structure lessons at every age and stage. She also greatly appreciates AIM and believes that her students have

She mentioned that AIM has kept several of her students going through the tricky middle and high school years when they have many activities competing for their attention - but having invested so much through the levels of AIM keeps them going.
